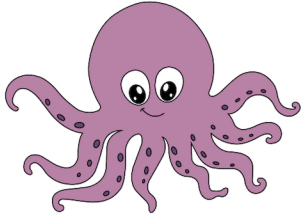


Sea Creatures

Mantis shrimp possess complex eyes, with 12 to 16 types of photoreceptor cells.



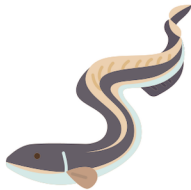
Sea otters hold hands while sleeping to prevent drifting apart.



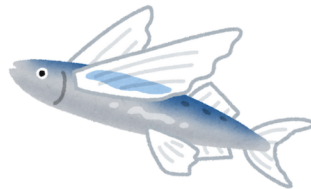
The blobfish is often called the "world's ugliest animal," yet its appearance is an adaptation to its deep-sea habitat.
