About 71% of the Earth's surface is covered by water, primarily oceans.



Mount Everest, at 8,848 meters (29,029 feet), is the highest point on Earth.



The mid-ocean ridge is the world's longest mountain range at over 65,000 kilometers.



Earth's surface is approximately 70% water, primarily in the form of oceans, seas, lakes, and rivers.



Mount Everest, located in the Himalayas, is the tallest mountain on Earth's surface, standing at 29,029 feet (8,848 meters) above sea level.
