The Colosseum in Rome, Italy, is an ancient amphitheater that could hold up to 50,000 spectators



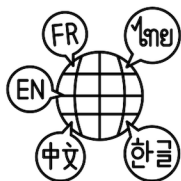
The Alps are the highest and most extensive mountain range system in Europe
