- Intermontane Plateaus: These are surrounded by mountains, such as the Tibetan Plateau.
- Volcanic Plateaus: Formed from volcanic activity, such as the Columbia Plateau in the United States.

The Largest Plateau

 The Tibetan Plateau is the largest and highest plateau in the world, often called the "Roof of the World". It covers approximately 2.5 million square kilometers and has an average elevation of over 4,500 meters (14,800 feet).

Climatic Influence
